If they had waited until the weekend to head north, they would have been in the long evacuation line that was seen on the news.

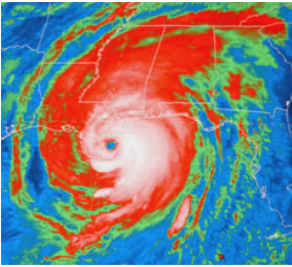
I know Mark and Dixie have a lot of friends left behind that they worry about and we wish those friends a lot of luck through and after this storm.
